Know Your Contract

Article 11: Teaching Conditions: Section 11.18: Health and Safety

A. "The Agency and the Association recognize the importance to the educational process for children of physical facilities provided by component districts to their students. Employees shall report to their immediate supervisors, in writing, situ-

ations where, in the judgment of the employee, the physical condition of the classroom threatens the health or safety of the students in the class or is significantly different than the condition of other classrooms in the school building. B. Upon receipt of such report, within five working days, the

immediate supervisor shall make an evaluation of the condition and shall prepare and submit a written report to the teacher and his or her Deputy Superintendent regarding what actions, if any, should be taken to alleviate or rectify the situation.

What Ruth Bader Ginsburg Meant to Education

During a Unique Learning unit on ", "Living with Rules and Laws" students in the Columbia High School NYSAA class had to answer the question, "What is a problem in our community?" 
